NJFCC Prints: Advancement to the Class A Level

After a review of the NJFCC Print Competition results for the last three seasons, the NJFCC is happy to announce that the individuals below have received sufficient award points to advance them to the Class A Level. The current NJFCC criteria for this achievement is the accumulation of 8 or more points in a one to two year period. Points assigned are as follows: 6 for Plaque, 5 for a medal, 4 for a Merit award, and 2 for an HM. Congratulations!
