TIPS FOR CHOOSING A PHOTO WORKSHOP

A photo workshop can be a very helpful and rewarding experience, however it's important to remember that all workshops are not the same. Some are geared more to the beginner, and others are directed at more advanced photographers..

I have found the workshops that are geared towards the beginner spend as much time giving lectures and slide reviews as in the field. This is not necessarily negative, since the beginner can gain from both areas.

I prefer a workshop that will enable me to have maximum time in the field, giving me as many varied photo opportunities as possible. Part of the benefit of paying for a workshop is having the workshop directors put you at the right place at the right time. I gauge the success of a workshop by how many quality photos I get during the time spent with them.

If you're looking for a workshop where you can maximize the number of quality photos, question the organizers about how many people they will be taking on the workshop. If it's a large group (15-30 people) the odds are that you will not be able to jump from place to place very quickly, thereby reducing the photo opportunities you will get.

With a large group, you will generally go to one location in the morning and one in the afternoon. In my opinion, these people are not earning their money. They might charge less per person, but they're giving you a whole lot less.

Prices of workshops can vary greatly. It's

important to find out if they include meals, lodging and transportation during the workshop in the fee. Some will give you all three and some may not.

Some workshops may advertise that a big name photographer is one of the instructors. Some of these photographers are good teachers, while others are not so good. Do not gauge the workshop too strongly on what great photographer will be there.

If you see instructors shooting their own images while you are in the field with them, this is not a positive for the workshop in my view. These people are being paid a lot of money to assist you and not to fatten their portfolios. Don't hesitate to interrupt them if you have a question.

Asking club members about their experiences with some of these celebrity instructors might be helpful.

Most workshops are not cheap. One way to evaluate a workshop is by how many full days of shooting they are offering. A 5 day workshop could cost as much as \$2500 after you calculate all expenses. Therefore if you're spending \$500 a day, you would like to feel that you are getting your money's worth. Of course, only you can evaluate your satisfaction in relation to the services offered.

Most Importantly!! No matter how good the workshop is, if the weather is terrible it can destroy your chances of good photography, so remember that when taking a workshop there are no guarantees.



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
