# EQUIPMENT REVIEW

### JOBY ULTRAFIT SLING STRAP Keith Patankar Hunt's Photo & Video

Camera straps are one of those things you love or hate. There is nothing more frustrating than carrying around bulky, clumsy camera equipment that doesn't fit properly on your strap, bounces around when your moving and worst of all leaves your shoulders and neck feeling sore. In recent years there have been several "sling" style straps introduced to the market. Some feel better than others, but always seem to have a quirk that leaves you feeling like something is missing.

The newest player on the market hopes to fix these quirks that prevent all these straps from becoming the perfect travel camera strap. The Joby UltraFit Sling Strap has been designed for the photographer who wants a comfortable strap that is easy to use and allows you to quickly bring the camera up and shoot while securing the camera comfortably on your hip area when walking around. This new strap does do a good job in addressing several points that are key when walking around with a camera.



The first thing you will notice when you open the box is the simplicity of this strap. There is no setup required or adjustment other than adjusting it to your body type when you put it on. You mount it to the bottom of your camera with the quarter thread screw. It is very easy to attach and pivots 360 degrees on a circular base plate. This feature is really nice and moves smoothly without hitting against the camera bottom. The screw and bearing is constructed of metal, but the rotating clip is made from a plastic material, which concerns me on the durability over time. However, it does feel solid and seem like it would last overtime. The only other thing I would have liked to see is a thread to mount on a tripod without having to take of the strap. The strap itself is made of a light, no intrusive fabric that is not cumbersome and does not dig into your shoulder. The material is very thin with minimal padding. This seems to work well for this straps design. While I have not been able to go on any long hikes wearing the Joby UltraFit Sling Strap, on my small excursions it has felt comfortable. The camera stays in place on my lower back hip and does not bounce around, which it very important. It is also fairly easy and quick to bring the camera up into the shooting position. If you are looking for a simple, easy strap that makes walking around with your full DSLR comfortable it is worth checking out the Joby UltraFit Sling Strap.
