This award is the highest individual honor bestowed by the Federation.

The Citation Committee consists of Nick Palmieri, Chair; George Hall, NJFC; and John Sandstedt, NJFC.

To nominate a candidate two forms must be completed. The first, the Proposer's Form, presents the accomplishments of the nominee as describe by the Proposer. The second, the Endorser's Form, is an independent endorsement of the nominee by another party.

Completed nomination documents must be sent to Nick Palmieri at docnick@comcast.net. The deadline for receipt of the Proposer's Application and Endorser's Forms is February 15, 2014.

Happy New Year to All!

2014 has started with a cold, snowy bang here in the Boston area! Right now temps are hovering around zero degrees and there is two feet of fresh snow on the ground! Tough to get excited about photography when the weather is like this but, inspiration comes in many forms. When the weather is unwelcoming outdoors, think about shooting indoors.

Portrait photography is fun on a stormy day. Your light can be from your strobes, your small flashes (speedlights), or window light. It is all good. Personally, I shoot more and more portraits with my Nikon speedlights. These small strobes are lightweight and very versatile. Two products that I love to use in the field with my speedlights are Promaster Pop Up Backdrops and Lastolite Ezybox Hotshoe softboxes. Both are affordable and very portable.

Promaster Pop Up Backdrops come in a variety of colors and measure 6 x 7 (feet). They make for convenient, professional backgrounds anywhere. They open and close easily and do not require background stands. Simply stand them against a wall or clamp them to something. Most backdrops are two sided (different color on front and back) giving you more options for headshots and portraits. At \$159.99 they are more affordable and easier to use than many muslins.

The Lastolite Ezybox hotshoe softboxes are fantastic. These easily assembled softboxes are easy to use with speedlights. They come in three different sizes allowing for a variety of lighting options and each is made to accommodate your speedlight with a wireless trigger (such as a Pocketwizard) attached if needed. Since they mount on the outside of the softbox, they can be used with the Nikon Creative Light System or the new Canon wireless flashes. The 24 x 24 (inches) softbox gives enough coverage for headshots, $\frac{3}{4}$ portraits, and children. They even come in a strip box for more dramatic lighting.
