### 1<sup>st</sup> Teaneck International Competition and Exhibition for Photojournalism

Teaneck Camera Club's 1st International is a worldwide competition for digital projected photographs illustrating Photojournalism. This contest welcomes entrants from around the world and it is not necessary to belong to the Teaneck Camera Club to enter.

Members of Teaneck Camera Club have organized and administered this event under guidelines prescribed by the Photographic Society of America (PSA).

Entries must be submitted online by October 19, 2015. An entry consists of 4 images. The images will be judged by a panel of three judges on October 31st, 2015 at the Rodda Recreation Center, 250 Colonial Court, Teaneck, NJ 07666 starting at 11 am. All are welcome to attend and watch the proceedings at any time and leave at any time.


Photojournalism images consist of pictures with informative content and emotional impact, including human interest, documentary and spot news. The journalistic value of the photograph shall be considered over pictorial quality.


Photographers enter these competitions to gain Acceptances in the Photographic Society of America (psa-photo.org). After the images are scored, the higher scoring images are given Acceptances. The highest scoring images will receive Honorable Mentions and then the top scores will be awarded Medals. Entrants do not have to be members of the Photographic Society of America.

After the judging is completed, the accepted images are organized into a digital show that will be presented at the Teaneck Camera Club in January. The show will also be presented to two other camera clubs in the NJ area and will be available for viewing on the Teaneck Camera Club website.





#### **JUDGES TRAINING PROGRAM A SUCCESS**

The NJFCC conducted a training program for new judges in an attempt to alleviate the shortage of judges available for area camera club competitions.

The sessions were conducted during the month of June and four experienced judges, Ben Venezio, Dave DesRochers, Nick Palmieri, and Vinnie Kempf led the sessions. There were two groups of trainees separated into two different session dates with a total of 18 trainees. We had a total of 23 people apply for the course but date conflicts and two no shows reduced the total to the 18 mentioned. Each trainee was allotted a half hour in the judge's chair evaluating images selected by the trainers. Feedback from the trainers was given to each trainee during their chair time. The images were a combination of 9s and 5s to give each person a feel for what happens in a real competition.

The feedback we received from the trainees was very positive with some good suggestions for how to improve the program. We took into account the feedback from the first session to fine tune the second one. All in all, the program was a resounding success as measured by the fact that 12 of the trainees placed their names on the NJFCC Judge's List volunteering to judge area competitions.

So if your club selects one of the new judges be a little easy on them as they break into a role requiring some skin thickening.
