To Edit Or Not to Edit...That Is The Question By Rick Berger HUB Camera Club

If Bill Shakespeare were around today busily enjoying photography as a hobby, his "To Be or Not to Be" soliloquy from Hamlet might read like the title of this article.

There is a raging storm of controversy taking place these days in photographic circles between the purists and just about everyone else who owns a camera, cell phone, iPad or computer. The debate centers around whether or not photos should be edited or, according to the purists, left untouched just as they came out of the camera. Today's devices have the ability to alter photos through internal editing software. It's up to the user to determine how much image altering should be done. In some cases, the gadget itself makes the decision. For instance, take the simple act of shooting a JPEG image. When we shoot these, the camera automatically performs a series of alterations. By the time we glimpse at the image on our LCD screens, the image's information has already been compressed, sharpened, and its colors have been saturated. Now, on top of this, many of us make additional changes using Photoshop, Lightroom or any of the gazillion plug-ins now available. The purists shudder to think of how we ruin, distort, or otherwise destroy good shots by applying this digital magic as compared to years ago when photography was unblemished by these interferences. However, in truth, since photography's humble beginnings, alteration of the image has always taken place. The process, however, took place not in the camera or computer, but in the darkroom. Sometimes a negative required special developing because we had shot our film at a higher ASA (now called ISO) than was recommended or we enhanced or cropped an image when we projected it onto printing paper. At times we purposely left the print in the developing solution a little longer to produce a darker image. These processes were simply yesteryear's version of post shooting editing.

So what's the answer to Shakespeare's quandary? Just as it's your choice as to whether to continue shooting film or to shoot digital, it's your decision whether to edit or not. At the risk of offending the anti-editing purists, if you want to give me a call to defend your position, you'll probably have to leave me a voicemail because I'll be busily engaged at my computer editing a group of my latest photos.


